Ask Madame Pres!!

I would like to take a moment and talk to you about one of our Major Streak Charity.....Warrior Foundation, Freedom Station. There still seems to be some confusion about Freedom Station. First, Warrior Foundation, Freedom Station is **local**. It has no ties to Wounded Warrior Foundation that is a national organization and is being asked some questions about how they are using their money.

Freedom Station is a grass roots organization (501c3) like us. It offers a direct avenue for the citizens of San Diego to help assist those who fight for our freedom. NOT ONE Board member or volunteer receives one cent for their help. Every penny goes directly to help our wounded warriors. Sandy Lehmkuhler, President of Freedom Station, tells me that over the past year the number of wounded has doubled at Navy Hospital and the demand for another Freedom Station is high. The command at Navy Hospital has asked Sandy and the Freedom Station Board if it would be possible to establish another Freedom Station as they do not see the war against terrorism going away.

The OTHGSD has worked very close with Sandy over the past 8 years and when the Gang donates money to Freedom Station we have always asked Sandy "what do the warriors need that directly impact them?" Sandy has always had a small project that has needed this type of help, i.e.: bought the first golf cart used at Navy Hospital; twice, sent a crew of Gang Members to clean and help set up cottages when remodeling was done; supplied dishes, bedding, etc. for one cottage; combine 2 single car garages and create a weight room & equipment for their use; remove 2 sets of termite infested stair cases, rebuild them & paint them; set-up a garage for wrench turning with tool boxes, hand tools needed for them to work on their cars or the warrior chopper; and this year supplied a much need second golf cart for use at Navy Hospital. Some of these projects took more than 1 year of donation from the Streak.....like this year Golf Cart. The Gang voted to give \$7,500.00 to Freedom Station from Streak 41. Sandy was asked "what do our warriors need?" Sandy, with out hesitation said we need another Golf Cart at Navy Hospital. The cart was over \$11,000.00. So, Streak 42 money will finish paying for the cart and move on to another small but significant project that our warriors benefit from directly. Again, Sandy will be asked "what do our warriors" need that the Gang can directly impact?

I have heard rumors that some gang members think that Freedom Station has gotten "too big" and we need to find a little organization that need us. Yes, we are a very small part of a very big project, but it takes a lot of small parts to make an "engine" work.....we all know what that is like. The Streak has 8 "Major" Sponsors (\$1,000.00 or over), but we also have 22 "Main" Sponsor (\$500.00) that keeps the Streak alive. With out the "little parts" to an engine the "Big Block" can not run.

I want to thank the following Gang Members for contributing financially to Streak 42: Bruce & Debra McDowell of Framing Associates, Dorothy Bangiola of C & G Early Ford Parts, Steve Cushman from Bonk & Cushman, CPA's, Shawn & Tammie Bush from 1 Call Flood & Construction Specialist, and the 10 members that donated \$100.00 each for the two \$500.00 Grand Raffle prizes.
