Minutes for February 3, 2010
Called to order: 7:00 PM by Ralph Garcia, President
Adjourned: 8:10 PM

Guests/Visitors: Again I missed the name of our visitor and I apologize.

Minutes: The reading of last month's minutes waived, approved as is, M/S/P.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Jerry Ringland read the treasurer's report.

New Members: Welcome new members:

Dorothy Bangiola and **Joseph Marciano** owners of a 1940 Ford Sedan Delivery. Dorothy is the owner of C & G Early Ford Parts and Joseph is a realtor for Prudential California Realty.

Richard (Dick) Earner owner of a 48 Chevy Coupe. Dick is a retired lineman from Pac Bell. I must apologize as I have repeatedly reported Dick's last name as Gardner in previous meeting minutes. (Sorry Dick)

Correspondence/Car Club Council: Joe Pifer went over some of the coming events. CCC needs our support for their event on 6/15 at Balboa Park. Joe asked for a show of hands and got 15 + promising to attend. Joe also went over some of the new state laws that went into effect January 2010. Overdrive had a nice write up on these laws and the fines.

Streak Report: We have 247 registered to date. Flyers are on the table, please take some and pass them out at all the runs you go to.

Medical Report: Eddie Fitzgibbons has been added to the donor recipient list to receive a new liver, praying this will happen soon. Even with a new liver Eddie still has a lot of other medical conditions that he is battling. Keep him in your thoughts and prayers.

Old Business:

Insurance: The board got 4 quotes on insurance for the club. Current policies total \$5,334.97 per year. Sharon Lipscomb, Jerry & Francie Ringland's daughter, took our current policies and came back with a quote of \$3,006.86. Sharon was also able to get us a 0 deductible at no additional cost and waived the customary fees for us.

M/S/P to purchase new policy thru Sharon Lipscomb in the amount of \$3,006.86.

OTHG Incorporation: Ralph announced that when Jerry Ringland was trying to find out what our tax ID number was and get a copy of our exempt status letter we discovered OTHG had not completed or filed the necessary paper work to be incorporated. Contact was made with the attorney who had been working with us in 2006 and he informed us that a letter was sent to us in June 2009 from the state that said we had not filed for exempt tax status and we had not filed the required tax returns. This was followed by at least 2 more letters from the state, and finally on 12/10/09 the letter from the state said if we do not file our tax returns and the missing paper work the corporation will be suspended. Ralph Garcia, Mike Newell, Denise Hume and Sue Chambers had a meeting with the attorney and found out that we are not a nonprofit corporation, but currently a California Mutual Benefit Corporation. He felt that he would be able to correct the situation if we got our tax returns filed and finished filing the incorporation paper work. The attorney will file with the state for retro status when the 501(c) 7 is approved. Ralph called the Franchise Tax Board and was told that if we filed our 2006 tax return by February 26 we would not be suspended. It is estimated that we will need between \$2,000 and \$5,000 to finish. This includes attorney fees, filing fees, possible penalties and tax preparation fees. Ralph will have a more exact figure by next meeting. Sue Chambers is getting the financials done and Steve Cushman has offered to complete the tax returns for us.

M/S/P no more spending until corporation status is resolved.

Attorney advised some changes in our bylaws as follows 7.11 Webmaster, 7.12 Car Club Rep. and 7.13 Club Historian. Bylaw Title changes from Bylaws to "Restatement of Bylaws, First Amendment". 3.1.2 Inactive members entirely deleted. Bylaw numbers have been sequentially numbered by the attorney.

Minutes for February 3, 2010 continued:

M/S/P above changes in Bylaws.

Club Store: Only \$5.00 for all 2009 Steak T shirts.

New Business: Goodguys Del Mar show is almost upon us; Martin is doing the Poker Run again. No changes in club parking from last year. Ed Witek is in charge of the indoor parking. Saturday gate needs more help between 6 AM to 9 AM and 9 AM to 12 AM to handle all the cars coming in. Dick Torres has made up a work schedule, if you want to volunteer please let him know ASAP.

Everett proposed that the club not host the lunch at the Del Mar show due to the money crisis the club is currently in.

M/S/P tabled until we know what our corporation expenses will be.

Club Putt/Tech Night: Ralph Garcia sent out an email calling all for an impromptu putt on 1/31 and got 14 - 15 cars to show up. Ralph plans on having more of these so be sure to check your emails. Joe Pifer is planning a Borrego run for the 2nd week in March.

Runs/Reviews: None discussed.

Cars & Parts: Were announced.

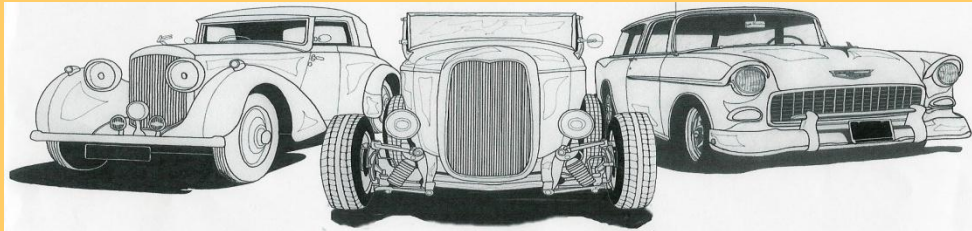

Notes from Car Club Council of Greater San Diego

TURF TALK:

Craig Moya spoke to us regarding the upcoming “Greatest Show on Turf” (a.k.a. GSOT). The show committee meets at 6:00 p.m. right before the monthly CCC meeting (1st Tuesday of each month) – everyone is invited and urged to come and participate in the show’s planning. Craig is still asking for a firm commitment from each membership club, whether it be to register and display cars, donate monies or prizes for the raffles, commit volunteer bodies to work the show or any other area the show needs help. The GSOT will not go proceed if the commitment is not there. There’s no need for just a few people to do all the work for a show that there’s very little interest in! Come on guys (and girls) this is our way to “pay rent” in a sense to use the museum for free for our month meeting.

CLASSIC BUSINESS:

Last month there was quite a shakeup regarding the CCC, the by-laws and how the council operates. The board of directors did have a meeting during the month of January to address the issues that surfaced and we are taking the matters to heart. We felt the current by-law regarding voting on officers needed changed. A motion was passed to formally change the by-laws to read the voting for officers will be done by written ballots. A motion was also passed that states only current representatives can vote and there is no time limit for the length of service that a representatives needs to have served before he or she can run or vote for a position on the board.

The topic of a website was further discussed. We are in agreement that a website is desired and needed by the CCC, although how to efficiently and cost effectively construct it and maintain it is still being ironed out.

One new addition to the meeting is the “Information Board” which is visible when you come into the room. On the board will be posted the current CCC roster, copy of by-laws, minutes, treasurer’s report, and the news from both SEMA and the ACC. Please don’t remove these copies as these are for all of the members to share – if you need a copy of anything from the board please ask an officer and we’ll arrange for a copy for you.

LEGISLATIVE ALERTS:

Have you heard of new “Move Over Law”? It states if there is a vehicle with flashing lights on the side of the road you must, if the traffic allows you, to move over into the next lane before you pass by the vehicles. This means any flashing lights –tow trucks, Cal Trans, emergency vehicles of any kind and law enforcement – if you can safely merge into the next lane you must – if you can’t merge you must slow down to a safe highway or roadway speed. If you fail to do this the officer stopping for the infraction can issue you a ticket to the tune of \$754, three points will be added to your driving record, and a day before is a judge is mandatory. Now it’s always been a law you needed to “proceed with caution” when passing an emergency vehicle on the side of the road at the scene of an incident. Yes we know the state is looking for means to increase revenue for the state, so traffic violation fine have soared. Another way to boost revenue – eliminate free parking! According to Cal. Democratic Senator Alan Lowenthal (District 27) chairman of the state transportation committee, he stated “this was necessary because as long as there is free parking, public transportation would fail”.
