AT
NATIONAL SPRING

National Spring of El Cajon held a Tech Night for the Over the Hill Gang on February 12. The Tech Night was to start at 6:00 pm so in the traditional Hot Rod fashion Gang members started to show up at 5:15. More than 60 members of the Gang and some friends showed up. We had 27 Hot Rods in the parking lot and numerous door slammers. It was extra nice to see Charter Members Bill and Kathy Sanders there from Oklahoma.

The crew at National Spring was busy setting up our feast for the evening of Hot dogs, chips, chocolate chip cookies and drinks. Each member was greeted at the door by one of the Hertel family members. Ben Hertel is the General Manager and was instrumental in setting up the Tech night. His brother Tim was the chef for the evening. Tim purchased 120 hot dogs and he announced that he has served 118 before we all went in to the shop for the presentation. Dad Phil spent the evening meeting new friends and renewing old acquaintances from the car and off road community which he has been involved with his entire life.

After our gourmet dinner we were all treated to an hour presentation by the crew. Ben explained springs and how they work and why quality material and workmanship is so important to safety and performance. The hammer man Bill used his 8 lb hammer, which he got from his dad many years ago, to demonstrate how to arch a spring to perfection. He stated that some spring sets require 4200 hammer strikes to get them arched properly. After Bill finished his demo, Jim lit the kiln and turned the end of a 6' spring cherry hot. He placed it in WWII machine and formed a perfect eye on the end. He explained the different kinds of eyes and their uses. Ben stepped forward after the demonstrations and summarized the evening presentation. **GREAT TIME HAD BY ALL.**
