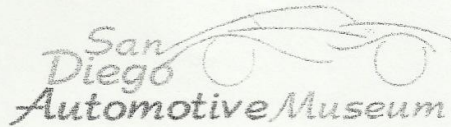

WHY DID WE EVER DO IT???

In the wake of the controversy concerning the raffle rules, and our compliance with them, there have been questions about why we ever bothered to become a recognized non-profit entity. Since I was helpful in getting the club to its non-profit status I thought it might be beneficial to review the thought process and decisions that led us to non-profit status.

First and foremost for me was liability. As a loosely organized club with no legal status any injury or damage that occurred at any club event would put every single member at risk. Club meetings, tech nights, club putts and of course the annual Streak events were all potential sources of trouble. It's easy to think "It's all club members and nobody would sue fellow club members." But the reality is that when someone is hurt lawyers typically get involved and they go looking for money anywhere they can find it. This aspect of liability applies to all club members whether you were at the particular function or not. The club does buy insurance that covers us for specific events but, to my knowledge, it doesn't cover us for all the things the club does. The best and most effective way to limit individual members from liability was for the club to become a corporation. A corporation's liability is limited to its assets only, shareholder assets are protected. Once a corporation is formed tax law says all net income is taxable unless you are a recognized/qualified non-profit entity. Hence the need to become a recognized non-profit.

So, becoming a non-profit had nothing to do with changing the purpose of the club or re-focusing our efforts solely on raising money to give away. It did however become an attractive aspect for potential sponsors/contributors since giving to a recognized non-profit entity is a deductible expense. Giving to any other kind of group would not be a deductible tax item. This aspect has helped us raise more money in sponsorships and contributed items for the raffles.

The club's status as a non-profit, in my opinion, has not changed the approach to how any function is held. The Streak is still being held annually, we still have club putts, tech nights and we still meet monthly. What has changed is our level of protection and recognition as one of the better run and organized car clubs in Southern California.
